Literacy Liftoff Programme

We have started Literacy Liftoff in Junior and

Senior Infants. Literacy Liftoff is a classroom programme of intensive instruction. It involves three to four teachers working with the children at four stations in the classroom.

The main focus is on reading books and writing stories. It is

based on the premise that children learn how to read best by reading continuous text and learn how to write by writing. Children are organised into reading groups based

on their reading ability. It has the following aims: to raise the literacy levels of pupils in the school, to provide the pupils with a set of strategies to be confident readers, practice in writing will help the pupils to become independent writers, to give the children a sense of enjoyment

and achievement and to develop the pupils' language and creativity.

Above all it is fun!!!

classes were invited to join basketball practice after school with 00000, a student at the IT Tralee. We hope to have it back next year!




And 5th and 6th class had Football Soccer training with coaches from the Tralee branch of the FAI Football Association in Ireland, who kindly come every year to our school.
